Nationally, there are nearly 6 million people with intellectual and developmental disabilities (I/DD), and an estimated 1.5 million people rely on DSPs to support them.

Speaking of staff recognition, Congratulations Roxann Maloney! Roxann is the first staff to collect all four "TVDS" chips. The new "TVDS" employee recognition system began in January 2023. Since that time, over twenty-seven chips have been given out by fellow staff, supervisors, directors, and Administration. Roxann is a case manager who works with persons served in Chanute, Iola, and Fort Scott.

The Foundation has begun to plan for our 2024 fund-raisers. Our annual silent/live auction event is tentatively set for Tuesday, April 16th in Chanute.
